Sue M agreed to contact Jeannette to ask her to update our Facebook page to publicise the forthcoming trip to Montesson and the quiz night in November. We are also planning to have our fundraising events listed on the Town Hall website and in the free magazines such as Chiltern View.

September Visit 2018

Although the Montesson committee still haven't confirmed the date, we are 99% sure that it will be the weekend of 14th -16th September since this is the weekend of the Fête du Pâté à la Carmen that the Twinning weekend always coincides with.

Linda is researching transport, but without a final number it is very difficult to give a precise cost. The aim will be to keep the cost below £120 per person. Indeed last year it was around £100. This is because Linda hired and drove a 9 seater minibus. She is prepared to do the same again and will even drive a 17 seater if needed. Ideally there will be more than 21 people which would make a coach with driver an affordable, if not necessarily the cheapest, option. Clearly this needs to be booked sooner rather than later. Sue will write to the membership as a matter of urgency asking for definite responses. Roy will post details of the weekend on the website and twitter and will share a link with Thame for Europe via Twitter. As always if you have friends or family who would like to participate, please contact Linda. As Owen remarked at the meeting, if we could fill a 50 seater coach, the cost would be reduced to around £50 each.

Christmas Events 2018

Our main concern is that the Montesson Christmas Market may be held on the same weekend at that in Thame, although given that we have given them ample notice of the Thame date and that the Montesson market is organised by the Twinning Committees over there, we hope that it will be the 24th Nov. If there is a clash, we will just need extra help to man the 2 locations. We certainly need the income generated by our stall in Montesson.

9 **May Visit 2019**

It will be hard to repeat the success of last May! Linda will keep in touch with Marie-Jane Barnett and we hope that she will be able to support us again. However we recognise that she has many other groups which she supports and we have already been very lucky to benefit from her incredible generosity.

However, it is very clear that the new format of holding the meal on Saturday evening worked very well and everyone loved the dancing that went with it. We doubt that anyone would complain if we did something similar again. Carl made the point that, not only was the event more enjoyable, it was also cheaper. We should however recognise that this was mostly due to the generosity of the

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Barnett's.

Consequently we're on the look out for a venue that could accommodate us at a reasonable price with affordable catering. The 3 Horseshoes in Towersey has renovated their barn resulting in a bigger usable space – this could work, although there wouldn't be room for everyone to have a sit down meal and dancing. The Barns Centre was also suggested. We are open to ideas. The date has still to be decided.

Thame Twinning with John Hampden and Montesson Schools

During the May weekend, a very productive meeting was held between members of the Thame and Montesson committees and a John Hampden Primary School teacher. The idea is to forge a link between the 2 schools with pupils messaging each other, sharing projects, telling each other about their town etc. The local teacher is extremely enthusiastic and keen to make this work and we wish to support her. Don knows the headmaster, so if it looks like things are stalling or running into difficulties, he can have a word and Sue M is happy to assist if needed (and allowed?) in the classroom. As our efforts to link Lord Williams' with a Montesson school appear to have disappointingly and frustratingly come to nothing, we are very determined to support this initiative and to make it work.

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- 1. Don reminded us that the Mayors of both Montesson and Baesweiler (Germany) are keen to set up a 3 way twinning. In theory this sounds good, but we worry about finding accommodation for an increased number of visitors. We should revisit the idea at some point and look at the practicalities.
- 2. Sue M thanked everyone for their help and support at fundraising events, especially for their help on the carnival stall which required many helpers.
- 3. David repeated the need to reach out into the community and to increase our membership, by having articles and advert published in the Thame Gazette and other local publications.
- 4. Sue Kogan thanked committee members for making her feel so welcome.
- 5. Owen queried the potential grant that we had offered to us last year if we were to join with the Sinai twinning group. Linda explained that this was just for a one off event and that the committee decided (supported by members at the last AGM) that the completely different aims and way of twinning by the 2 associations meant that we didn't think think that it was appropriate.
- 6. Liz thanked the committee for their hard work
- 7. Norma thanked Linda for driving the minibus.
- 8. The committee thanked Phyllis Brown (see Apologies) for her generous donation and her support of the Twinning Association.
- 9. Linda closed the meeting by introducing us to the idea of Toilet twinning. Those present agreed that we should look into it and that it would be a way for the twinning association to support a worthwhile charitable cause. The committee will discuss it at a future meeting.
